Regathering: With guidelines established by the Episcopal Diocese of Indianapolis, Holy Family has created a Regathering Team that will meet regularly to discuss the steps for reopening the church building safely. The team consists of Father Bruce Gray, Deacon Cathy Scott, Dr. Doug Tannas, Dr. Katie Swec, Ruth Everett, Bob Murray, Lorri Batesky, Jolene Johnston, Bethany Paden, and Ben Paden. The team concurred with the Vestry that public worship at Holy Family should only happen when it is safe for the entire parish to regather together. No one wants to exclude anyone due to age or health vulnerabilities. There is no way to predict when conditions will improve enough for Holy Family to reopen, but the Regathering Team is beginning to consider various approaches and strategies for when the congregation

can come together again. The team is not simply waiting, but instead, they are preparing and will be meeting every two weeks to both prepare for and facilitate the eventual resumption of in-person worship at Holy Family.
